

Following World War II, some German students volunteered to help rebuild a cathedral in England, one that had been badly damaged by the Luftwaffe bombings. As the work progressed, they were unsure how to best restore a large statue of Jesus with his arms outstretched and bearing the familiar inscription, "Come unto Me." The repair was complete except for Christ's hands that had been completely destroyed. They asked the question, 'Should we attempt to rebuild the destroyed hands or determine another option?' Finally, the workers reached a decision to leave the hands off the statue and change the inscription to read: "Christ has no hands but ours."

The call of God for all believers is to be the hands of Christ in a broken world. For some of us, that 'calling' leads to a pastoral or professional type of ministry. Yet the primary calling set forth in scripture is that all saints would step into a lifestyle of serving and sacrifice, offering who we are and what we have for the work of the Lord.

Moses learned this lesson when God asked him, 'What is that in your hands,' referring to the staff he carried. For Moses, his staff represented his identity (being a shepherd), his income (that shepherding was his source of provision), and his influence (as Moses guided and protected sheep with his staff). Moses discovered that God's calling is an invitation to offer the most common things of life—our identity, income, and influence—for the good of others.

There's an old story about a man walking along the shore after a big storm had passed to find the vast beach littered with starfish. He noticed a young boy approaching occasionally bending down to pick up one of those starfish and throw it back into the ocean. The man asked the child, 'Why?' He answered, "When the sun gets high, these starfish will die unless I throw them back into the water." The man replied, "But there are thousands of starfish on this beach. I'm afraid you won't really be able to make much of a difference." The boy bent down, picked up yet another starfish and threw it as far as he could into the ocean. Then he turned, smiled and said, "It made a difference to that one!"

THE SPIRIT IS NECESSARY

Every believer is called. Often, we use that term to refer to vocational ministry, which is, of course, a very important aspect. However, there is also a calling to secular vocations. We need Christ's followers in every aspect of our lives. I, for one, am thankful for a physician who loves Jesus.

As ministers, we should affirm everyone's calling, recognizing that not all are called to pastoral ministry. I used to tell my students, don't stoop to be a doctor if you are called to be a pastor. Don't stoop to be a pastor if you are called to be a doctor. The point is that we need Christian leaders who are Spirit-led in all aspects of our lives. That requires us to continue teaching and practicing the baptism of the Holy Spirit.

While I cannot cover all of the intricacies of our Pneumatology here, let me give five reasons why the Spirit-filled life is essential to all who are called.

First, Greater Witness

Acts 1:8 "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. And you will be my witnesses, telling people about me everywhere—in Jerusalem, throughout Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." NLT

Second, Greater Worship

1 Corinthians 14:25 "As they listen, their secret thoughts will be exposed, and they will fall to their knees and worship God, declaring, 'God is truly here among you.'" NLT

Third, Greater Prayer

Romans 8:26-27 "And the Holy Spirit helps us in our weakness. For example, we don't

know what God wants us to pray for. But the Holy Spirit prays for us with groanings that cannot be expressed in words. And the Father who knows all hearts knows what the Spirit is saying, for the Spirit pleads for us believers in harmony with God's own will." NLT

Fourth, Greater Holiness

Galatians 5:22-23 "But the Holy Spirit produces this kind of fruit in our lives: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against these things!" NLT

Fifth, Greater Unity

Ephesians 4:3-6 "Make every effort to keep yourselves united in the Spirit, binding yourselves together with peace. For there is one body and one Spirit, just as you have been called to one glorious hope for the future. There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all, in all, and living through all." NLT

We do not have the power to fulfill our calling outside of the Spirit's empowerment. Our greatest need is for the Spirit to be active in our daily lives. Be open to how the Spirit wants to move in your life. Welcome Him in and ask for His participation. I can assure you I need the Holy Spirit in my life.






CHI ALPHA Campus Ministries

God calls each of us differently into ministry. Moses was called before the burning bush, while Peter and his companions after a long unsuccessful night fishing. I came to Christ in 1998, toward the end of the year while attending the University of Kinshasa, Democratic Republic of the Congo. A friend shared with me the four spiritual Laws used by Campus for Christ. This is where it all started. In 1999 I did my first 3-month training, received a certificate, and remained

under the supervision of the elders and the pastor. I made a covenant with God that if He helped me to study without failing I would serve Him for the rest of my life. I was vice president and president of the evangelization commission, trainer, and mentor of new believers.

In 2012 I decided to go to seminary. But before going to seminary, I served by vocation as a preacher in the cells, and in the church, I was vice president and president of the young people in the cell, vice president, and president of the district assembly. God by his destiny allowed me to come to the USA in 2017. In 2019, I met Pastor Muller Malonda of C3AG Franchaphone, Louisville, KY. It was during an invitation from Pastor Darren to attend SAY YES WEEKEND, that God resurrected again in me the flame of the ministry. I responded to what God says in Matthew 28:18–20.

On April 23, at NetCon24, I received my License credentials with the Assemblies of God and I will continue working toward my ordination by attending KSOM (Kentucky School of Ministry).
